

REACH POLICY

REACH is a regulation of the European Union, adopted to improve the protection of human health and the environment from the risks that can be posed by chemicals.

REACH stands for <u>Registration</u>, <u>Evaluation</u>, <u>Authorization</u> of <u>CH</u>emicals. It entered into force on 1 June 2007.

In principle, **REACH** applies to all chemical substances; not only those used in industrial processes but also in our day-to-day lives, for example in cleaning products, paints as well as in articles such as clothes, furniture and electrical appliances. Therefore, the regulation has an impact on most companies across the EU. The aim of REACH is to enhance protection of human health and environment.

REACH – **Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC)** are chemical substances which have been proposed - that use within the European Union be subject to authorization under the REACH Regulation. Listing of a substance as an SVHC by the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) is the first step in the procedure for authorization or restriction of use of a chemical. The first list of SVHCs was published on 28 October 2008 and the list has been updated many times to include new candidates.

Based on current and available information, Raltron / RAMI Technology hereby declares that its products, do not contain any of the REACH Substances of Very High Concern (SVHC) above a limit of 0.1% by weight according to the Candidate list published by the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) in Helsinki. Raltron / RAMI Technology shall monitor all changes to this directive and Annexes XIV and XVII and ensure that our products continue to be Compliant with all future requirements and amendments.
